**Support a Canadian pledge of \$1.2 billion to
the Global Fund
to fight HIV, tuberculosis and malaria.**

**96% of malaria deaths occur in Africa.
80% of those deaths are children under five.**

There is something we can do:

We can support the Global Fund as it works towards a world free of HIV, TB and malaria.

The Global Fund, created in 2002, is widely regarded as one of the most effective and efficient funding mechanisms for combating these three deadly, yet preventable diseases.

In 2020, in countries and regions where it invests, the Global Fund funded antiretroviral treatment for 21.9 million people living with HIV, TB treatments for 4.7 million people, and distribution of 188 million mosquito nets to prevent malaria.

For its 2022 **replenishment**, the Global Fund's funding target is at least US\$18 billion, to support recovery from the devastating impact that COVID-19 has had on the fight against HIV, TB and malaria, and to strengthen health systems to build a healthier, more equitable world.

As a founding partner, Canada has been a leader in supporting the Global Fund with steadily increasing contributions and multi-year pledges. During the last round of funding, Canada pledged \$930 million over three years. The United States has pledged up to \$6 billion for this next replenishment, with the proviso that their contribution will be capped to 33% of the total pledged by all donors. By paying our share, Canada will help ensure the maximum US contribution, demonstrate continued leadership, and send a strong message to other donor nations.

The Grandmothers Advocacy Network (GRAN) is a nonpartisan network of volunteers who advocate in Canada and internationally for program and policy changes that will promote and protect the human rights of vulnerable women and communities in the Global South, with a specific focus on older women, children, youth, and gender-diverse persons in sub-Saharan Africa.
